NEW BUSINESS

Storm damaged roads discussion with Municipal Auditor, John Mooney – A special emergency in 2023

that has raised an expenditure for the next 5 years which equivalates to \$500,000 per year that will need to be offset. There are two options, we can increase the 2024 municipal taxes by approximately .31 cents which is equivalate to approximately \$400 to the average taxpayer. If FEMA money begins coming in during 2024, we can use those funds in 2025 bringing the tax rate back down to the 2023 level. The other option is to use the deferred school tax increasing our fund balance and are available for our use to offset the expense in the budget. As of 12/31/22 we have approximately \$1.1 million that could be deferred for use during this emergency. The auditor will address all the matters covered with our CFO to make sure we are all on the same page.

Engineer Finelli will obtain an update as to the Dioxane Water Project and the reimbursement of grant money to the township.

Mayor Toretta redirected agenda discussions until the municipal attorney is present and proceeded with the Engineer's Report.

Let the record reflect that Attorney Benbrook joined the meeting at 7:27 p.m.

REPORTS/UPDATES

Engineer Report – Engineer Finelli informed us that a contract was awarded to Tom Bartha & Son, for the repair of Montana Road, in the amount of \$98,400 and was awarded the emergency repairs based on the emergent condition exception to the Local Public Contracts Law. Other bidders were KDP Developers in the amount of \$127,820 and Union Paving & Construction in the amount of \$133,400. Construction to Montana Road started today in hopes to be completed in a week. The Dioxane Project final preliminary design has been sent/received by 4 agencies: Railroad, County, NJAW, Fire Department. A check in the amount of \$2500 is pending to be sent to the Railroad. Resolution 2023-63 passed this evening to authorize the extension for Millbrook Road Section 2 Resurfacing can be used to replace the storm drains and the grant money can be used for this in coordination of storm damages.

After a discussion with the Highlands Council, the engineer doesn't see much hope that the Highlands will grant money to the township for soft cost.

Attorney Report – Attorney Benbrook informed that there is still no clear answer after speaking with our municipal planner if the Dollar Tree is still interested in building on the old Playmakers site on Route 57. A discussion as to how to proceed and what properties to offer either to contiguous property owners or by auction. Confusion as to the Tigar piece the township foreclosed on Block 41 Lot 12.01 the bank also foreclosed on as well after receiving the amount for a lien redemption from our previous tax collector. The bank wants to continue or initiate a suit against the township. Attorney Benbrook informed us of the fees we incurred on our end \$31, 414.24, Planner fees \$3,500 and attorney fees that we want to be reimbursed if we choose to give it back to the bank. With the reimbursement funds received from the bank this would then be owned again by Tigar, and the bank taking it back via a foreclosure then a Sheriff's Sale. Another matter as to a Tax Sale Certificate redeemed by George Banghart, his name was misspelled on one and two liens were redeemed. We now owe the former owner the payoff. This matter will be addressed in November when all committee persons are suspected of attending. Farm Leased Land Notices have been prepared and will hold a verbal auction at the start of our December 4th meeting. Franklin Township farmers will be given the priority, then adjoining farmers, Warren County Farmer then all others. The current contract farmers have been informed not to start any work or fees until contracts have been awarded.

Repairs at the EMS building is ongoing from the storm damage cost to repair just under \$180,000. Township owned trucks have received maintenance service and are in good working condition.

ORDINANCE 2023-9

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKLIN TO ESTABLISH A NEW CHAPTER 106 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRANKLIN ENTITLED "PENALTIES AND FINES"

BE IT ORDAINED By the Township Committee of the Township of Franklin, in the County of Warren, New Jersey, that a new Chapter 106 entitled, "Penalties and Fines" is hereby established as follows:

Section 1.

106-1. Penalties and Fines Established.

- A. For violation of any Ordinance set forth in the Code of the Township of Franklin, the Court before which any person is convicted of violating any Ordinance may impose a sentence of one or more of the following: Imprisonment in the County jail for any term not exceeding ninety (90) days; or by a fine not exceeding \$2,000.00; or by a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days.
- B. Any person convicted of violating an Ordinance within one (1) year of the date of a previous violation of the same Ordinance shall be sentenced to an additional fine as a repeat offender of not less than \$100.00, in addition to any other sentence imposed by the Court.
- C. The minimum penalty for violating any solid waste disposal Ordinance shall have a minimum fine of \$500.00 and a maximum fine of \$10,000.00.
- D. The minimum fine for the violation of any Ordinance not relating to solid waste disposal shall be \$100.00.
- E. Prior to imposing a fine for a housing or zoning code violation in an amount greater than \$1,250.00, the owner shall be provided a thirty (30) day period within which to cure or abate the condition.

106-2. Repealer.

- A. All other ordinances or parts of Ordinances of the Township of Franklin heretofore adopted that establish a maximum fine inconsistent with the fines established pursuant to this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- B. All Ordinances that establish a minimum fine that is less than the minimum fine set forth in 106.1. shall be repealed. All Ordinances establishing a minimum fine greater than \$100.00 are repealed.
- **SECTION 2.** If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 3.** This law shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

Said Ordinance will be considered for final reading and adoption at a regular meeting of the Township Committee to be held on November 6, 2023 at 7 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the Township Committee may hear this Ordinance at the Municipal Building, 2093 Rt. 57, Broadway, New Jersey, at which time all persons interested may appear for or against the passage of said Ordinance.
